It's been a very busy start to our year-working with our certificated classes and welcoming our new pupils to the faculty. Meanwhile our S3-S6 classes have been working hard learning new topics and skills and already thinking about the exam diet and coursework requirements.

Enterprise Club: This October saw the launch of our new S1-S3 Enterprise Club. The Club meets every Monday lunchtime in room 303. We are looking forward to sharing with everyone very soon what our first fund raising enterprise event is going to be.

Revision and Study Sessions: We just wanted to remind everyone that staff are available every lunch time to give additional support to pupils or to provide a space for pupils to undertake additional learning or homework. Wednesday lunchtime in room 215 is dedicated to Computing Science support. After the October break, we will announce which days will have dedicated support for Accounting, Administration & IT and Business Management.

Out and About: Mr Duncan was off to Emerson on 30 September to discuss possible events we could run with our S3 pupils over the course of this session. I can't disclose too much just now, but I think our S3 Admin and Business Management pupils are going to enjoy the activities our Faculty and the Stem Ambassadors at Emerson are putting together. The Games Development class visited NESCol where they were given a presentation by some of the students who had just completed a year of study and created their own computer games. This proved to be great inspiration for the games that our pupils will be creating this year.

In and Around: Our S1 cohort are going to receive a visit from KPMG, a multinational company who are experts in cyber security and will be talking to the pupils about how they can stay safe online. Our senior Computing Science classes will also be visited by representatives from Aberdeen University about opportunities of study in the exciting and varied fields of Computing Science. The Games class were visited by staff from the Video Standards Agency where they were taught how computer games receive their age ratings and were treated to an enthusiastic presentation with lots of game footage.
