End of Term festivities



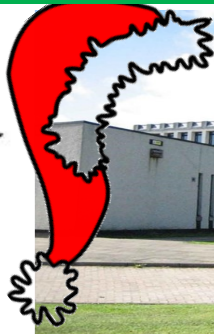

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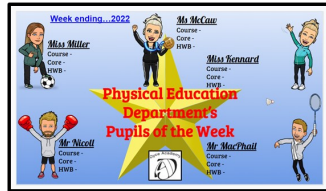
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Faculty Focus: Health and Wellbeing

Our competitor swimmers attended Aberdeen Aquatic Centre on Thursday 10th November 2022 to complete in the Scottish Schools Swimming Heats. All competitors swam in various stroke events and some managed to beat their times gaining personal bests! A great day was had by all.

Huge Congratulations to Rudy Da Silva who became the first junior to win all three Scottish, British and European championships in Muay Thai boxing. He won the three championships over the past 12 months making big waves in the sport. His stunning success has made him determined to become a professional by the age of 18. This year has seen the biggest uptake in school Football for several years with S1, S2 and Senior Boy's Football teams being formed to play in the city leagues. The seniors started their league campaign with a narrow 3-1 defeat to Albyn whilst the S2's have had a



draw, two wins and a single defeat. The S1's are looking for their first win. Girls Football also returned earlier in the year, and after a successful run to a 3rd place in Scotland at the 7-a-side Spar Cup in May (The tournament was fantastic, with the teams narrowly losing out after some excellent football played. It's been great to see so many of our pupils representing the school and long may it continue!

Faculty Focus: Pupil Support Guidance

Since summer we have been working with S2 pupils on understanding making healthy living choices. After the Christmas holidays our focus will change to career guidance where we will spend time supporting each pupil with their subject choice, which is coming up in February. At this time they will be making 5 subject choices to study alongside English and Maths for S3 and S4. Information will also be shared with home when we get closer to the time. In S4 we have focused on Mental Health and Study Techniques to help support them as they approach completing their qualifications. Recently we have also been discussing their future planning and what their thoughts are beyond S4.

We are now working with the seniors that wish to apply for a full-time college course as applications opened for their course at the start of December. We also share any opportunity that comes into the school for jobs, apprenticeship, work experience or events to research potential post school destinations further.

For any of our S4/5/6 pupils who need further support on moving on from school, maybe with jobs, apprenticeships, training courses our SDS Careers Advisor, Louise Fowlie, is on hand to offer assistance to any of our pupils.

We want to celebrate any achievements of our pupils so please let us know about things going on outside of school. We recognise wider achievement and want to recognise and acknowledge what pupils do beyond their studies.

On top of the supports that the Guidance Team can offer we work alongside our ACIS Counsellor for any pupil that may feel they need this form of support. We also have two Youth Workers that help with aspects of pupils' confidence, resilience and managing relationships, alongside issues such as considering risk and anger management.
