Both Mrs Scaife and Mr Kyle were delighted and overwhelmed with the performances put on by our young people which were met with rapturous applause by the whole audience. Our pupils then participated in a community performance at Dyce Church where they were sharing their passion for music with Dyce Friendship Club, and we have a number of other community opportunities lined up for next term. Our pupils have rounded off the term with another rousing performance here in school at our Spring Concert and Tuesday evening saw the Aberdeen heat of the Scottish Young Musician competition, where youngsters were competing from across Aberdeen to secure a place in the national final. For Dyce Academy it was an exceptional evening with 7 of the 11 entrants hailing from our school. The Social Subjects department have had a busy term especially in the run up to the start of the SQA exams after the Easter Holidays. The Advanced Higher Modern Studies pupils have handed in their dissertations and the senior pupils in other classes have been getting creative with their revision materials. Our Advanced Higher and Senior National Modern Studies pupils also had the chance to interview Lord Kitchin who is one of the UK Supreme Court Justices about his role in the justice system and the cases he has worked on- hopefully inspiring some future lawyers.

The S1s are currently completing their last history topic before S2 and have been working hard to find the historical mistakes in

Braveheart within our Scottish Wars of Independence topic. While the S2s have created some excellent shanty towns from recycled materials as part of our Developing World topic in Geography. We look forward to seeing many of the S2s stay in the Social Subjects depart-



ment as they move into their S3 classes at the change of timetable.

Following from Holocaust Memorial Day in January S2 RMPS pupils have been studying the Holocaust. Their focus has been on those who were most affected and remembering those whose stories may have been lost. S1 Parents can also look forward to the publishing of class newspapers on Google Classroom next term.

We were very excited to welcome up the P7s at our open evening last week and we were impressed with the knowledge many of them had. Our Natural Wonders and Ancient Civilisation topics were the topics everyone seemed most excited for and look forward to seeing the new S1s in August.

In the Home Economics department, we are busy preparing our pupils for their final Practical Cookery exam. SQA have given 3 recipes for them to prepare and cook within the allowed 2.5 hours. This is a stressful time for all concerned but we know our students are well prepared. Our National 5 Practical Cake Decoration class are also feeling the pressure with their final celebration cake to be finished this week. We have varied designs from a wedding cake to an Easter cake to several birthday cakes. Pupils have been showcasing their skills by modelling, texturing, crimping and embossing on their final cakes. Our S3 Practical Cookery class had a visit form Quality Meat Scotland. A representative from QMS came into class and after showing a short video on sustainability she worked with locally produced Scotch beef mince to produce a very appetising meatball dish, which everyone enjoyed tasting. Some students volunteered to help and were presented with aprons to take home. We had a very successful P7 open evening. In Home Economics we encouraged both pupils and parents to take the "taste test" could they tell the difference between full fat and low fat cheese? We also allowed pupils to try out our sewing machines. They programmed the machines and embroidered their names onto a book mark which they were delighted with.

The Technical Department would like to thank Jessica and Catherine (S4 pupils) for their amazing contribution with setting up and helping out throughout the evening. S1's and S2's have spent some time this

term learning and practicing some Computer Aided Design. S1's are creating some amazing robots using AutoCAD Inventor. We can't wait to see how their final robot designs turn out! S2's have been improving their CAD skills by creating a train and some other excited objects. The Nat 4 and 5 Practical Woodworkers have been busy working through their final



projects. Nat 5 candidates are completing a mirror frame with a drawer which also has decorative wood turned pieces. Nat4 candidates have been working hard to complete their toolboxes, they have done so well to create beautifully turned handles.
