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#### **SQA Appeals 2023**

SQA Results Day is Tuesday 8 August. Young / people will receive their results by post but also by text or email if they have signed up for this service through MySQA.

If results are not as expected, there is an opportunity for a young person to appeal to the SQA. Appeals can be made by young people directly to the SQA, or the school can do this on their behalf.

Appeals will be prioritised for any young person who has a conditional place at university or college.

An appeal does not allow for any alternative evidence to be looked at by the SQA. An appeal against a grade means that a senior marker will carry out a marking review of SQA-marked assessments. A marking review checks that:

- → all parts of the SQA assessments have been marked;
- the marking is in line with national standards;
- the marks given for each answer have been totalled correctly; and

the correct result has been entered on the SQA system.

Please note that after being reviewed, results could stay the same, go up or go down.

On 8 August, information about the Appeals process will be posted on the SQA website, the school website and in the relevant year group Google Classrooms.

### S5/6 Change of subjects

If, after receiving their results, pupils in S5 and S6 require to change their subject choices they should make an appointment to see their Guidance teacher during the first week of term. Appointment sheets will be posted on the bulletin board outside the Guidance Office on Tuesday 22 August. When the subject change has been made, pupil will be issued with a new timetable. ### Senior Pupil Ambassadors:

On the 5<sup>th</sup> June, when our senior pupils came back from study leave, they were given the opportunity of being part of the Dyce Academy Senior Pupil Leadership Team and to be an Ambassador within 5 groups. The five groups on offer are: Eco, Health and Wellbeing, Communities and Enterprise, Pupil Support, Primary to Secondary Transitions

Representatives from Emerson, Robert Gordons University, the University of Aberdeen and Mr Duns Barbershop encouraged pupils to apply for a position within the groups.

In addition, there was an underlying message woven throughout the presentations; "Qualifications can get you into a job but it's your skills that'll keep you there". 39 pupils applied to be an Ambassador and last week on the 28<sup>th</sup> June, those pupils attended a group interview where they were assessed on their skills of communication, organisation, collaboration, initiative, and leadership. On the 5<sup>th</sup> July, the successful candidates received their Ambassador Badges and were set the task of putting together an assembly informing the school who they are and what they plan to do within their respective groups. #### **Service to the School:**

Next session we are going to see the introduction of Service to the School roles for all of our S6 pupils. These roles provide a leadership opportunity for all of our S6 pupils, and will support with the development of key transferable skills that they can take with them into the world of work. Each of our pupils have chosen to take on one of the following roles: Being a School Ambassador, being a Peer Mentor, being a Book Buddy, being an MVP leader or taking on the SQA Leadership Award and carrying out a leadership project in an area of their choosing. Our pupils will carry out these roles for a minimum of a period a week and all will receive accreditation for their efforts. We look forward to sharing an update with you from the pupils as we go forward.

## Community and Enterprise Events:

June saw the return of our summer charity events including the eagerly anticipated Sponge the Teacher. We also had Guess the sweeties in the jar and a raffle. These events were part of the Northsound 1 schools challenge



where we fundraise to support in school initiatives but also some money does go towards Cash for Kids. We raised a total of £657.70 and because we came in 3<sup>rd</sup> place for raising the most money Northsound 1 matched our total, so we actually came away with £1315.40. The feedback from our P7's was that they really enjoyed being part of our school for these two days and that they are both excited and a little nervous about starting with us full time after the holidays. We, as a school, are also looking forward to welcoming our next new S1 cohort into our school family in August.

At the end of the unit pupils deliver their pitch to their classes and the winners go forward to the final in MPA in front of the whole year group. Imagine that – presenting to over 100 pupils! It can be daunting but every year the pupils make us proud of them. This year we would like to thank all of the English teachers for their hard work in supporting the youngsters; the PSAs who have really helped young people to focus and give their best perfor-



mance; the librarians, who for years have monitored and tallied marks and of course listened to the pupils practice their presentations; and finally to the current Advanced Higher pupils who worked with the finalists to help guide and support them in presenting confidently. Our final was judged by Katie Arthur (HT), Kevin Kyle (Director of ACMS) and Annette Smith (Librarian) and we thank them for their consideration and for giving up their time.
