
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A launch assembly was held for staff on the August Inservice and then for pupils once they returned and these shared expectations are now embedded in our everyday practice.

Library News It's been all go in the library this term with a range of activities for our S1 pupils -

In English - Pupils have been becoming acquainted with the fiction section of the library and learned how we as staff can help them progress with their personal reading. As well as the 10-minute- read at the start of every English lesson, pupils are encouraged to read at home for at least 15 minutes a day, it all adds up. They have been encouraged to make suggestions for books they would like to see in the library and some of these have already been ordered and are out on the shelves.

In Enterprise & ICT – Pupils came and worked in groups to research a country, it's culture and food. This research was then used back in the classroom where they are designing and marketing a new flavour of KitKat for the country they researched.

In Social Subjects – Ancient Civilisations Unit - Pupils came and were faced with 9 replica artefacts e.g. Viking drinking horn, Roman oil lamp, Egyptian ankh. They had to decide which civilisation it came from, what it was made of and what it was used for. A fun activity enjoyed by all. In Modern Languages - European Day of Languages. Pupils undertook a short competition where they had to use books, maps, dictionaries and information cards to answer a series of questions about various aspects of European countries.
