Welcome to the Christmas edition of our newsletter. We started this term by getting the residential trips organised for our Activities Week next May, and then we had the visit from the school photographer. We had a range of inter-house activities taking place, including netball and badminton and we have rounded the term off with a variety of Christmas concerts and a pupil and staff Ceilidh.

As a staff team, through our in-service and collegiate activities we have overtaken a series of lesson observations looking at our class routines and our lesson structure and we have engaged in moderation work with colleagues to ensure we have rigour in our planning for learning and teaching in the BGE. We have had a focus on our new systems for tracking and monitoring of pupil progress and been reviewing the interventions we have put in place to support our learners. Our Pedagogy Groups have been working away on piloting new approaches and establishing practice within their own classes, all of which will be showcased for all staff later in the year. We have heard a lot from our pupils, through pupil voice surveys and pupil voice focus groups, to gather their views on our progress with some of our improvement activities and they have given us some really helpful feedback which will support our next steps as a school. Last week we had a team of 7 colleagues form across Aberdeen City Council, conduct a Quality Improvement Visit to review our progress, observe our practice and hear from groups of staff and pupils about the work we have been undertaking. This has proved a really supportive process which again has fed in to our next steps on our improvement journey.

December also marked the end of my first year here as Head Teacher at Dyce Academy, my 'Schooliversary' as one pupil called it. The time has passed so quickly and I feel incredibly lucky and proud to be working for and with the young people of Dyce and the wider school community, and I look forward to what the future holds for us all. Wishing you all a very merry Christmas when it comes and all the best for 2024!


At the start of December, Mrs Dawson and Mrs Kirkwood took both

tor, Mike Bruce, and Senior Design Manager, Mike Duncan explained about the wide range of careers




in construction. They touched on the traditional site-based roles such as labourers, joiners and electricians, as well as more office-based roles such as quantity surveyors and engineers.
