### Welcome from Miss Arthur

This week our Guidance staff held the first House Assemblies of the year where the new House Mascots were being revealed following a week of House voting.



### Visit to Albyn

The workshops in this event were designed and facilitated by School Captains at Albyn school and was a great opportunity for our House Captains to network with pupil leaders from other schools across Aberdeen.

### Visit from the Army

This term, the Army visited Dyce Academy to put our senior pupil leaders through their paces as they worked together to solve puzzles and complete physical and mental challenges against the clock.

Through a range of activities, pupils learned the importance of effective communication in a team and how to identify the strengths of individual team members in order for the team to succeed. The skills that pupils developed will support them in their roles as senior pupils leaders at Dyce Academy.

### Corby House Captain Update

In our first term as House Captains, we have been planning our first ever house event. We have planned to host a quiz the week beginning 27th October. We will be doing one for S1-3 and another one for S4-6. ### Offshore Europe

A group of our pupils learned about the latest developments and future opportunities in the Energy Sector through a visit to 'Offshore Europe 2025'. Hosted at P&J Live Aberdeen, and supported though our partnership working with DWY North-East, pupils had hands on experiences with experiments from Glasgow Science Centre, problem solving activities from NESCOL, and 'speed date' networking with colleagues from the Energy sector to discuss career opportunities.

In addition to this, our pupils heard from Durham University's Solar Car racing team and the achievements that they have had in racing a solar powered car across Australia. Pupils had the opportunity to discuss in detail the how the team worked together to overcome the challenges that they faced. From this event, pupil feedback highlighted that they now had a better understanding of the Energy sector and the local, national, and international opportunities that are available. One example being one pupil now set to pursue Mechanical Engineering having learned more about the role and skills required through this event.









### Work Experience

Working with Robertson's Construction and our colleague from Enable, Jennifer, S4 pupils helped to refit the old Santander Banking building on George Street as part of their Personal Development Award (PDA). Once complete, our local charity Home Start will have a new home to move into.

All pupils that were involved got stuck in and not only was this a great introduction to industry for our pupils, but it was also a great opportunity to support out local community.





### **Rights Respecting Schools**

After achieving the Bronze Rights Respecting Schools Award last session, this term has seen us begin our journey towards the Silver Award.

We have launched this to all pupils through our Rights Assemblies in September, where we reminded all pupils of their rights and how they can participate in achieving the Silver Award. We have also held the first meeting of the Rights Respecting Schools pupils' group and next term this group and the Equalities Ambassadors will be working on promoting Rights around the school.









### **Outdoor Classroom**

We are excited to share a new outdoor learning area, located directly opposite the school campus, on the Donside of Riverview Drive (a 3-minute walk from the school).

Working closely with Aberdeen City Council's Forestry Team, a single giant beech tree (a casualty from last year's storms) was shaped to create this wonderful space.

There is seating for more than 20 pupils, with a 'chipped' central area for learning activities. Initially we will be using this space to run a Forest School project for our targeted support S1/2s, but the space is for everyone.

The team also created a pathway to make the site more accessible (although this may be a wee bit steep for some) - however, there are 3 alternative routes of varying length, to access this space.

With thanks to the hard work of Ms Byres and Aberdeen City Council's Forestry team for without this, this would not have been possible.

### Visiting Speaker, Adele Luta





NASA Mission Control Centre Flight Controller, Astronaut instructor, and TEDx speaker, Adele Luta, visited Dyce Academy this term to share her experiences in training for, working in, and supporting others, in extreme environments such as underwater, or outer space.

Speaking to over one hundred of our senior Science pupils, Adele shared her experiences in supporting over ninety space walks whilst working for NASA and the transferrable skills that she uses across the various roles in her career. Throughout her presentation, Adele encouraged pupils to pursue their interests and gave examples of how her hobbies, such as scuba diving, had led to her expertise being crucial to the training for weightlessness that astronauts experience whilst on space walks, through underwater exercises. Adele also shared some of the scientific and engineering challenges to living and exploring in extreme environments and the challenges that she overcomes.

Now at Oceaneering International Inc, Adele travelled from Huston Texas to speak with our pupils and alongside her colleague Jim McNab, based at Oceaneering International Inc in Dyce, outlined the relevance and the opportunities available for our pupils here in the North-East of Scotland.
